The Kids in Kenya Fund invites teachers to do an activity with their class. We will use your activity to introduce the kids from your class to the kids we will be working with in Kenya later in the near future.

The idea is to create a simple class activity in order to produce a class poster that can be laminated and shared with the schools in Kenya. While we are there we will duplicate the project with the Kenyan kids and bring it back to share with your class along with sharing pictures of how kids live on the other side of the world.

### Sample Class Activities:

- **What animals do you see? What does your home look like? What do you do for fun? ...any of these ideas or all of them could be a part of the poster- cut pictures out of magazines or take your own pictures.**
- **The start of a class pen pal ... We will deliver your class letter and work with the Kenyan kids to return theirs to your class upon our return. Take a class picture or build a collage poster so they see what your class and classroom looks like.**
- **Sing a simple song your class enjoys. Write the words down on your poster and illustrate the song. Video tape the class singing the song and we will play it while there in Kenya. We will then have the class sing a song for your class and return a similar project.**
- **Be imaginative, make it fun, involve the whole class. The purpose is to show the Kids In Kenya what it's like to be a kid in America.**
